

SAUSAGE EGG & BISCUIT CASSEROLE

| Ingredients: | | ½ cup | Milk |
|--------------|---------------------------|--------|---|
| 1 lb. | breakfast sausage-ground | 6 oz. | Colby & Monterey Jack Cheese shredded |
| | (Jimmy Dean sausage) | 6 oz. | Mozzarella cheese shredded |
| 1/2 | medium onion minced | ½ tsp. | Italian seasoning |
| 1 clove | garlic minced | | Salt & Pepper to taste |
| 1/2 | red pepper minced | 1 pkg. | Buttermilk Biscuits (Pillsbury) cut into |
| 8 | Extra large or Jumbo eggs | | 8 pieces, all but 1. Save it for the top. |



Start with a large baking dish (approx. 9 x 12). Spray with vegetable oil (Pam). Set oven for 350 degrees. Salt and Pepper lightly each step. Place a small amount of oil in a fry pan. Cook the crumbled sausage until pink is gone only about 5 minutes (don't brown it). Remove from pan and save enough fat to sauté the onions & red pepper then add garlic for just a minute. Add veggies to the sausage in a bowl. In a separate bowl whisk the eggs, milk and seasoning. Cover the bottom of the baking dish with the pieces of biscuits. Sprinkle the sausage over the biscuits then pour egg mixture over the sausage, sprinkle the cheeses over the egg mixture. I like to put the 1 whole biscuit in the center. But that's up to you. At this point you can bake in a 350 degree oven for 30-40 minutes. You have to check it. The center should be tested with a knife. The knife should be dry when you pull it out.

OR: Here's the neat part. Cover with foil. You can put the whole dish together the night before or let it sit in the refrigerator for at least 8 hours then bake. Also, you can put your favorite veggies in or even mushrooms or just the cheese, whatever you prefer. ENJOY!

FROM YOUR (INTERIM) PASTOR...

You will regularly hear that Christmas is for children. Indeed it is regularly our children and grandchildren who spontaneously and enthusiastically make the day special! On Christmas morning, even though they are on vacation from school and can sleep in, it is difficult to keep the kids in bed. They are anxious to see what Santa has brought them. And when they see the stache under the tree which is intended for them, they quickly tear into the presents.

Any wrapping quickly gets torn away as kids excitedly tear into whatever Santa has brought them.

As we begin another new year, this one 2024, God will once again <u>present</u> us with a new gift of time. Like a Christmas present many will tear into the new year with gusto and bravado. It's a time to celebrate, though often the celebration seems misguided. It fails to demonstrate true appreciation for the new gift that God is setting before us.

I hope that you (and I) will truly appreciate the new year with which God is presenting us. Unwrap it carefully, and likely slowly, in order to savor and appreciate that with which we are being blessed. Savor the moments, the time, that God is granting you. That, though, is one of those things which we regularly fail to do, at least as completely as we might or should.

It was years ago that the chaplain with whom I completed a unit of CPE, i.e. clinical pastoral education, introduced me to a woman who was terminally ill. A young mother of two with a husband who was able to provide substantially for her and their kids; they had nothing but good things to anticipate. Then, though, she was stricken with breast cancer. Though doctors had been able to arrest the breast cancer, still it was anticipated that the cancer would metastasize to her brain. The prognosis was dim.

Life itself became difficult for this woman. In particular she spoke of attending social gatherings with her husband where the conversations regularly turned to what everyone was anticipating doing in the upcoming days, months, even years. The conversations were difficult for this woman, though, because she couldn't count on days, months or years. The cancer could erupt within her brain at any time—and her days were numbered.

Though life was still difficult and challenging for this

woman, she had discovered a formula which helped her get through. She would take "5 at a time," i.e. whenever she was getting down, she would think of something meaningful and rewarding she could do in the next five minutes—and she would do it. What could she do to make life better for her daughters or her husband in the next five minutes. It didn't need to be something grandiose;

something simple would work. She found that doing things "five at a time" would give her a sense of accomplishment and fulfillment.

It is easy to make the mistake of trying to plan too far in advance along with focusing too much on the distant future. Savor the moment(s). Utilize the time that God is giving you to address something right in front of you. Ask yourself what you can do in the next five minutes to exemplify and enact the Spirit of Christ Jesus our Lord. You will then find yourself feeling more satisfaction and accomplishment as you become a faithful steward of the time God is presenting you. May we all enjoy a more blessed 2024 as we seek to mirror the thoughts and actions of Jesus "five at a time."



<u>God's love is constant</u>, it doesn't fluctuate with the passing times and seasons. We read in Jeremiah 31:3, "<u>I have loved</u> <u>you with an everlasting love</u>; <u>I have drawn you with</u> <u>loving-kindness.</u>" <u>God's love is absolute</u>. According to Webster's dictionary, that means

1) perfect; complete, 2) pure, 3) not limited, 4) positive, 5) real and 6) not relative.

1 John 4:16 affirms that "<u>God is love</u>" and 1 John 4:19 that "<u>We love because he first</u>

loved us." It is His very nature to love.

God's acceptance, love, approval and favor are not based on our performance. (Thank the LORD !!) It's all about <u>His</u> grace and unmerited favor. Ephesians 1:6, KJV, "<u>To the</u> praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved." <u>He made us accepted</u>. If it was based on our performance that would make it about us, but the reality is it's about <u>His Grace</u> and that makes it <u>all about</u> <u>Him</u>.

Romans 5:8 tells us, "<u>But God demonstrates his own love</u> for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for <u>us.</u>" And Romans 5:6, in part, "when we were still powerless, <u>Christ died for the ungodly.</u>" Ephesians 2:8 & 9 echoes the same message, "<u>For it is by grace you have been saved</u>, <u>through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of</u> <u>God- not by works, so that no one can boast.</u>" Why would we need the Holy Spirit if it was based on our own performance. 1 Corinthians 2:12, "We have not received the spirit of the world but <u>the Spirit who is from God, that we</u> may understand what God has freely given us."

<u>The unconditional love of God means there are no strings</u> <u>attached</u> and that you don't have to earn it. This is really good news because if you don't earn it, then you can't lose it. Just like <u>God's favor, it is not earned, it is bestowed</u>. People in this broken world will so subtly insist that we please them in order to gain their approval and acceptance. <u>We</u> <u>don't need to perform for God</u>. He doesn't place that heavy burden on our backs. <u>God's love is a freeing love</u> – not one that brings you into bondage, the bondage of having to perform.

It is so easy for us to equate the fallen, fallible and fickle attributes of our fellowmen/ women to God. This is why <u>we</u> <u>need to read the Bible and spend time alone with God</u> and <u>pray for insight thru the power of the Holy Spirit</u> to gain the <u>correct understanding of the nature and character of God</u>. Then we will also discover <u>our true value and worth to Him</u>. The Holy Spirit will reveal it to you. <u>Meditation will open</u> <u>the door to revelation and revelation will bring liberation</u>. There is no doubt, <u>God loves you unconditionally</u>, the Bible <u>tells you so</u>.
