FROM THE (Interim) PASTOR...

During the third century there was a hypothesis current which suggested that unmarried soldiers fought better than married soldiers because married soldiers might be afraid of what might happen to their wives or families if they were killed. Needing resolute men to fight in many unpopular and bloody campaigns, the Roman Emperor Claudius II, also known as Claudius the Cruel, accordingly tried to ban the marriage of young people. There were those, however, who opposed this edict, and among them was a priest in Rome named Valentine. He believed that marriage was a sacred act between a man and a woman and should be encouraged. And so he did marry young people. For this, his criminal behavior Valentine was eventually caught, imprisoned, and tortured. His execution entailed three parts—first beating, then stoning, and finally decapitation, all due to his stand for Christian marriage.

Legend suggests that one of the men who was supposed to judge Valentine in line with Roman law of the day was a man called Asterius, whose daughter was blind. The priest Valentine is supposed to have prayed with and healed the young girl with such astonishing effect that Asterius himself became a Christian. That notwithstanding, Valentine was killed on February 14th, 269. The story goes that the last words he wrote were in a note to Asterius' daughter, and he signed the note "from your Valentine," which has of course inspired today's romantic missives.

While not all saints were martyred, still not a few were indeed martyred for their faith. And that is remarkable. These individuals were so committed to the faith, so convinced were they of its truth, that they would put their lives on the line to affirm and confirm their Christian beliefs. Such belief empowered them to bear faithful witness to people around them—and the Church grew, even during times of overt persecution.

What's true then has not changed. People still recognize the fervor and commitment of those who dedicate themselves in the service of God. Martin Luther King, Jr. was such a man. He confronted bigots and racists with amazing nonviolence and simple love. The message caught on—and our nation and this world is better for it.

In this month of February, when the focus turns to love, remember those in our past, like Saint Valentine and MLK Jr., who have left an indelible imprint on this world because they chose to love and do what is best to embody that love. Your life, and the lives of those around you, will accordingly be uplifted, blessed, and improved.


