FROM THE (Interim) PASTOR...

Back in high school I recall being required to wear burlap underwear as part of the initiation ritual to become a member of the varsity club. Believe me, it was not one of my better memories of high school! Burlap is course and rough, and it itches, unlike the soft and supple underwear we typically wear.

Interestingly wearing sackcloth, which is akin to burlap, has long been a symbol of penitence, i.e. voluntary self-punishment for something you have done wrong. Penitence is a means of expressing genuine contrition for wrongdoing. During the Old Testament era persons coupled the wearing of sackcloth with sprinkling ashes on their heads to express their sorrow for their sins and faults. Even Jesus referenced the practice in a not unflattering manner.

Christians continued the practice of using ashes as an external sign of repentance throughout the first millennium. But then the discipline of public penance was dropped. The 40-day (actually 46 if you count the Sundays) season of Lent which preceded Easter was seen as a general penitential season marked by sprinkling ashes on the heads of all—and the wearing of sackcloth was dropped. And that's the way it continued until the Reformation era. It was then that the practice simply lost favor among Protestants, especially those at the Reformed end of the Protestant continuum. Reformed Protestants were disinclined to employ practices which might be viewed as promoting any sort of works righteousness and detracting from the significance of Christ. And therein lies a very real danger.

Still with Vatican II, which opened in 1962, and the emergence of the ecumenical movement, the use of ashes has become more commonplace among Protestants and has been openly encouraged in many circles, including churches of the Reformed-Presbyterian tradition. Hence, we will once again be holding a brief service of worship on Ash Wednesday, March 6, beginning at 7:00 in the sanctuary. Ashes from palm branches from previous Palm Sunday celebrations will be used to mark those who will begin the season of Lent as a time of penance, prayer, and fasting in preparation for the celebration of Easter Sunday. I invite you and encourage you to participate in this ancient, yet still meaningful act as a symbol of this special season. And if you are unable to attend, remember that the entire Lenten season is intended as a time for penance, a time to cleanse ourselves of sin, and a time to prepare to meet and greet our risen Savior and Lord Jesus Christ on Easter. Not only God knows that this world, and we as participants in it, could use a little more contrition and self-denial in order to enhance our lives as disciples of Christ Jesus.

Gary included this very interesting write up in the bulletin which is worth re-printing for those who weren't able to join us during the service.

"Holy, Holy, Holy!"

Holy, Holy, Holy was written for Trinity Sunday circa 1787 by Reginald Heber (1783-1826) with the melody written in 1861 by John Bacchus Dykes (1823-1876). This hymn text and its tune are bursting with references to the holiness of the triune god.

The mechanics of the hymn in text and tune are unique in hymnody. The end of each stanza rhymes with "Holy" and "Trinity". The tune name is Nicea in honor of the Council of Nicea where the doctrine of the Holy Trinity was first formalized in 325AD. The first six notes of the hymn tune form a triad which is a set of three notes stacked vertically in thirds. Each note is an interval of three notes apart from the other. I can think of no other hymn that textually and musically represents its subject matter more than this one.

The hymn is also timeless as its proclamation spans millennia. The text is derived from Isaiah 6:3 (8th Century BCE), Revelation 4:8 (81-96 AD), and the council of Nicaea (325 AD). Even after all these thousands of years the proclamation of One God in Three Persons remains strong. In fact, Holy, Holy, is considered one of the top 25 favorite hymns in the 21st century.
