FROM YOUR (INTERIM) PASTOR...

It happened a year or two before I was born. The furnace and pipes on our house were being replaced. As the new furnace and pipes were installed, the old ones were laid outside on the lawn, where my two older brothers discovered them and decided it would be great fun to crawl through them. When my parents discovered them the only thing white about either of my brothers were the whites of their eyes. Their faces, hair, and clothing were all covered with soot, ash, and charcoal. The two of them would have been fitting for an old minstrel show!

In April my wife Eileen and I traveled to Fort Sill, OK, for the graduation/promotion of our grandson Gabriel from boot camp. (He is currently stationed at Fort Sam Houston near San Antonio, TX, training to become a medic.) Because Eileen has had surgeries on her knee, hip, and shoulder, I was not only carrying my stuff but much of hers. When the plane landed in Oklahoma we deboarded, and I forgot one of my things, the bag with my backup prosthetic leg. Now while American Airlines personnel can be faulted for not checking the overhead compartments to see that everything had been removed, it was my shortcoming. Hence I ended up making a trip to Walmart to purchase, among other things, a new toothbrush and toothpaste. What I ended up purchasing was rather surprising—a toothbrush with black bristles and black Crest toothpaste. Obviously these products are created with activated charcoal. Still brushing your teeth with black bristles and toothpaste does seem counterintuitive to cleaning and brightening your teeth.

The same could be said, I'm sure, about being cleansed by the blood of Jesus. Blood saturates and stains. If you happen to get blood on something you soak it in cold water and put it through the wash to get the bloodstain out. Blood is not something that you normally think of for cleansing.

Yet that is one of the miracles of our Christian faith! The blood of the crucified Jesus serves to cleanse any and all of the stain of sin. To many, I'm sure, that seems counterintuitive. Yet almost every disciple of Christ Jesus will assure you that it is true. While the Apostle Paul reminds us "all have sinned and come short of the glory of God," still God, as God had done with the sacrifices offered for sin in the Old Testament, still God accepts the blood of Jesus as an atoning offering to wipe away the sin in our lives. It is amazing—and it is liberating! We can be free of the sin we have perpetrated. Hallelujah!!, i.e. literally praise the Lord!!

By the way, by the time I was born my brothers had been all cleaned up. I think my parents ended up using cold cream and plenty of soap. I'm not certain if any of my brothers' clothing was salvaged or simply tossed out. It certainly took no little effort to get my brothers cleaned up. So it is with us. It took nothing less than Jesus' painful and bitter death on the cross to redeem us from our sin. It wasn't easy! But it was liberating and exhilarating! Always remember to celebrate that divine forgiveness in Christ Jesus!

P.S. And as a postscript, American Airlines did finally locate the bag with my prosthetic leg and sent it to me. I lapsed, and American personnel may have lapsed a little, too. But things did work out.

The One who formed us in our mother's womb knows us and knows our frame and what we need to sustain us. In Matthew 11:28, Jesus encourages us with, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." That is, he says, "rest for your souls." As we sit in the LORD's Presence, we find that rest from our performance mentality and learn to lean on Him. It's where we find refreshment.

Strong's concordance defines "rest" as 1) to give intermission from labor, to give rest, to refresh so to recover strength. There is a God ordained rhythm to life. He gave the Israelites a day of Sabbath rest. God knows what we need and doesn't want us stressed out and burned out. In Mark 2:27, Jesus declares, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath." The NIV study bible describes it as, "a day intended for man (for spiritual, mental and physical restoration).

In her book, 'Living with Thorns' author Mary Ann Froehlich writes, "God intends for us to seek and find rest, completely focusing on Him without distraction. This act replenishes our resources." She describes a Sabbath rest as a time to reconnect with God. Then goes on to list 3 requirements to accomplish this: 1) Laying our burdens down 2) to stop focusing on our troubles and remember how God cares for us. 3) A retreat day for complete rest. Our wonderful choir director has taught me that even in a measure of music there is sometimes a "rest", a pause and a chance to take a breath.

Some of the key elements in finding this rest, author Froehlich continues, include worshiping God, reading his Word and communicating with Him through prayer, silence and solitude. Learning to listen is so important to hearing from God, as is setting aside the time to focus on His promises to us and His unchanging attributes. Truth brings joy and that is found in His Word.

When Moses asked the Lord who he was going to send with him to lead the Israelites to the promised land, "The Lord replied, "My Presence will go with you, and I will give vou rest." (Exodus 33:14) In standing against those who oppose us, we have the exhortation of Psalm 37:7, "Rest in the Lord and wait patiently for him." (NKJV) In the NIV it's, "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him;"

Sometimes it's hard for us to "be still" or to "rest" because we think we should "do" something to fix our circumstances or try to figure it all out. But God tells us in Isaiah 30:15, "In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength..." And in Exodus 14:14, "The LORD will fight for you; you need only to be still." So, in other words, maybe we should stop and acknowledge to ourselves that God is in control and rest in the fact that He is so very good and much more kinder than we know.

TERIYKAI GLAZED CHICKEN

1 LB CHICKEN BREAST HALVES BONELESS AND SKINLESS, CUT INTO STRIPS

3 TBLSP CANOLA OIL

4 MEDIUM SWEET CARROTS, JULIENNED

1 MEDIUM SWEET ONION, JULIENNED

½ CUP SOY SAUCE

1/4 CUP PACKED BROWN SUGAR

4 SERVINGS RICE, COOKED AND HOT, FOR SERVING

SESAME SEEDS (OPT'L)

TO TASTE, TOASTED FOR TOPPING GREEN ONIONS(OPT'L) TO TASTE, SLICED FOR TOPPING



DIRECTIONS:

STEP 1 In a large skillet or wok, stir-fry the chicken in 2 tablespoons of the oil over medium-high heat until the meat reaches an internal temperature of 165 degrees, about 6-8 minutes

STEP 2 Transfer the chicken to a plate and set aside.

<u>STEP 3</u> In the same skillet, stir-fry the carrots in the remaining oil for 2 minutes.

<u>STEP 4</u> Bring the sauce to a broil, then add the cooked chicken to the skillet.

<u>STEP 5</u> Combine the soy sauce and the brown sugar in a bowl and add it to the skillet.

STEP 6 Bring the sauce to a boil, then add the cooked chicken to the skillet.

<u>STEP 7</u> Boil the chicken mixture until the sauce slightly thickens, about 5 minutes.

<u>STEP 8</u> Serve the chicken mixture over the rice and sprinkle with the sesame seeds and the green onions.
